Over The Counter Sale of US Savings Bonds Ends

The Bureau of the Public Debt announced that as of January 1, 2012, financial institutions will no longer sell paper savings bonds.

The US Department of the Treasury has set a goal to increase the number of electronic transaction with citizens and businesses.

Stopping the sale of paper savings bonds will save taxpayers approximately \$70 million over the first five years.

Savings Bonds are not going away. Series EE and I electronic savings bonds will remain available for purchase in TreasuryDirect-- a web-based program operated by the Public Debt.

Investors have been purchasing savings bonds online since 2002.



Through this program, investors have an easy, safe and convenient way to purchase and manage their bonds. It's also FREE! Now you don't have to worry about losing or misplacing your bonds.

If you still have paper bonds, you can continue to redeem them at financial institutions. If you have bonds that have not matured but were lost, stolen or destroyed, they can be reissued in paper or electronic form.
